STAFF EXPECTATIONS

- Yearbook students must be trustworthy, reliable, self-guided, responsible, innovative, quick learners, and problem solvers.

- ALL assignments are given a deadline and are due ON TIME. Deadlines will be stressful. You must be committed to working under pressure.
- You must be willing to interview people you do not know and be curious to learn more about them and tell their stories through words and images.
- After school work sessions will be necessary to meet deadlines.
- Attendance during class is mandatory.
- Staff members are expected to sell ads the summer before the school year and help market the yearbook throughout the year.
- All yearbook students will commit to at least one year of being on staff.
